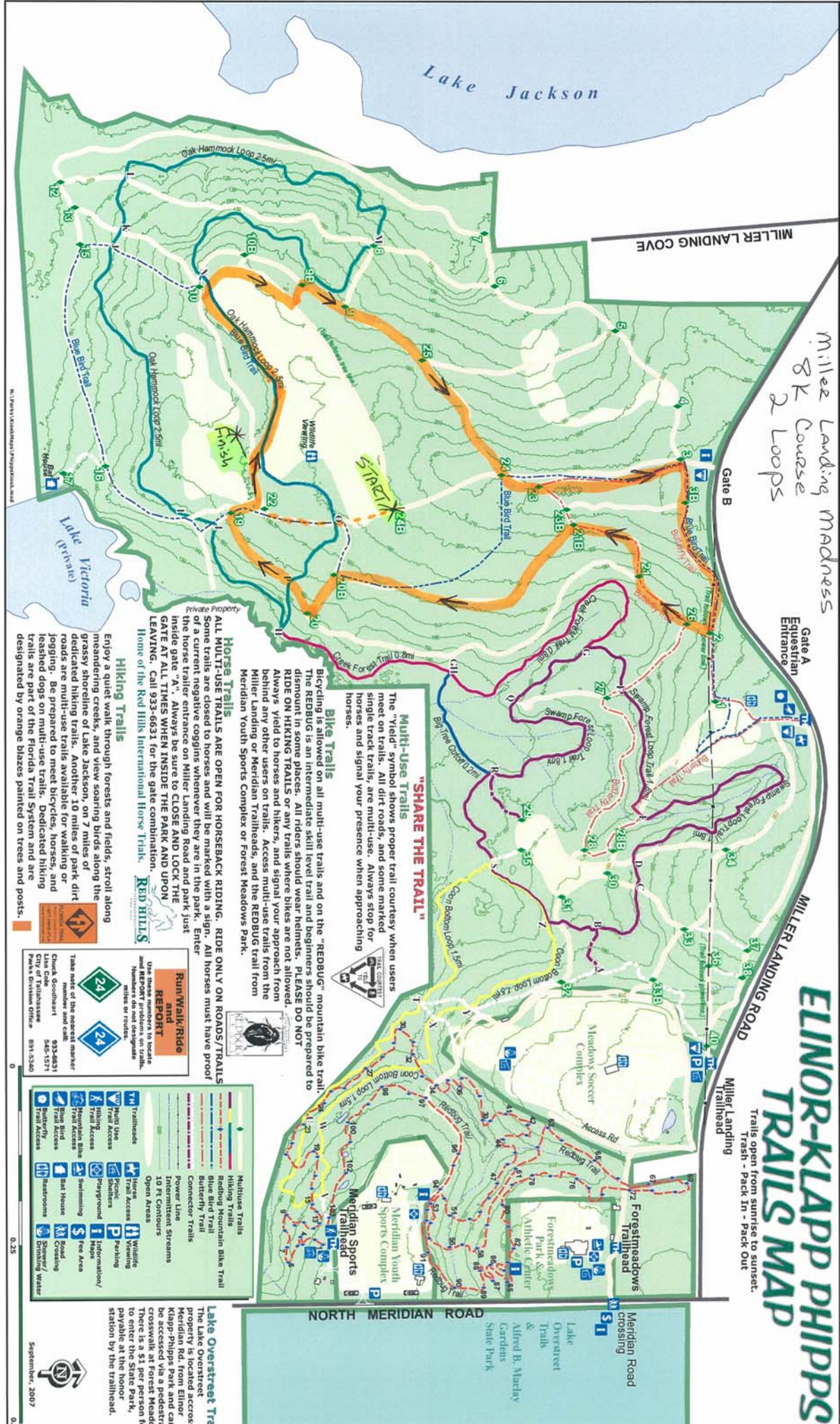


Miller Landing Madness

"SHARE THE TRAIL"
 Multi-Use Trails
 The "yield" symbol shows proper trail courtesy when users meet on trails. All dirt roads, and some marked single track trails, are multi-use. Always stop for horses and signal your presence when approaching horses.

Bike Trails
 Bicycling is allowed on all multi-use trails and on the "REDBUG" mountain bike trail. The REDBUG is an intermediate skill level trail and beginners should be prepared to dismount in some places. All riders should wear helmets. PLEASE DO NOT RIDE ON HIKING TRAILS or any trails where bikes are not allowed. Always yield to horses and hikers, and signal your approach from behind any other users on trails. Access multi-use trails from the Miller Landing or Meridian Trailheads, and the REDBUG trail from Meridian Youth Sports Complex or Forest Meadows Park.

Horse Trails
 ALL MULTI-USE TRAILS ARE OPEN FOR HORSEBACK RIDING. RIDE ONLY ON ROADS/TRAILS Some trails are closed to horses and will be marked with a sign. All horses must have proof of a current rabies negative cognis whenever they are in the park. Enter the horse trailer entrance on Miller Landing Road and park just inside gate "A". Always be sure to CLOSE AND LOCK THE GATE AT ALL TIMES WHEN INSIDE THE PARK AND UPON LEAVING. Call 933-6631 for the gate combination.

Hiking Trails
 Enjoy a quiet walk through forests and fields, stroll along meandering creeks, and view soaring birds along the grassy shoreline of Lake Jackson, on 7 miles of dedicated hiking trails. Another 10 miles of park dirt roads are multi-use trails available for walking or jogging. Be prepared to meet bicyclists, horses, and leashed dogs on multi-use trails. Dedicated hiking trails are part of the Florida Trail System and are designated by orange blazes painted on trees and posts.

Run/Walk/Ride REPORT
